



## EXPLORING CANCÚN, THE RIVIERA MAYA AND BEYOND

History buffs can book excursions to the impressive Mayan archaeological sites of Chichén Itzá, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the New Seven Wonders of the World, Tulum (with a stop for snorkeling in the inlets and lagoons at Xel-Há National Park), Ek Balam and Cobá. Also popular is the two-day getaway to the gracious colonial city of Mérida, capital of the Yucatán, which features a side trip to the ancient city of Uxmal, also a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a jewel of Mayan architecture, and the colonial town of Izamal. Other historical and cultural options include one-day trips to Mérida and the Sotuta de Peón hacienda, the colonial town of Valladolid, Mexican cooking classes and visits to Mayan communities. For a Mexican evening out, Xoximilco Park is a celebration of Mexican cuisine and music and is inspired by the famous floating gardens and canals of Xochimilco on the outskirts of Mexico City, with colorful barges known as *trajineras*.





For nature lovers, Contoy Island bird sanctuary, Sian Ka'an and Río Lagartos Biosphere Reserves are worth a visit any time of the year, and summer visitors also have the opportunity to sign up for a once-in-a-lifetime eco trip to swim with the whale sharks. These gentle giants, the world's largest living fish, gather in the northern waters of the Mexican Caribbean from mid-May to mid-September to feed on plankton.

Families will enjoy a fun-filled day at the Riviera Maya's famous nature and adventure parks. The list includes Xcaret, Xel-Há, Xenotes Oasis Maya, Xenses, Crococun and Aktun Chen. For the adventurous, Río Secreto, Xplor, Hidden Worlds, Dos Ojos and Selvatica parks beckon and there are jungle jaunts featuring zip lining, rappel and snorkeling in *cenotes* (sinkholes that are formed over thousands of years as a result of erosion of the limestone). The agency also offers trip to Isla Mujeres, Holbox and Cozumel, dolphin swims, scuba diving, snorkeling and fishing excursions.

Renting a car gives members and guests who return to the Mexican Caribbean year after year the freedom to explore on their own and go off the beaten track. The car rental desks at the resorts offer family-size vehicles, jeeps and vans in standard or automatic models. Maps are available and guests are ready to discover the area.

Traveling south along Highway 307, guests can explore the Riviera Maya at their own pace, calling in at every spot along this stretch of coastline dotted with fishing villages, resort communities, secluded beaches and inlets, cenotes and caves, nature parks and archaeological sites. Further afield lies the Zona Maya or Mayan heartland, an area of dense forests, farming villages and historical sites clustered around the town of Felipe Carrillo Puerto in central Quintana Roo. State capital, Chetumal, on the border with Belize, is the gateway to the south, an area that boasts fascinating archaeological sites such as Kohunlich, Dzibanche and Oxtankah, jungle reserves, Bacalar, the Lagoon of Seven Colors, and the beaches and reefs of the Costa Maya.

Traveling west from Cancun along the Mérida toll road or Highway 180, guests can explore timeless Mayan communities, the colonial towns of Valladolid and Izamal, cenotes, caves and archaeological sites such as Chichén Itzá and Ek Balam.

Mérida is also the ideal base from which to explore Uxmal and a series of lesser Mayan





sites collectively known as the Puuc Route, colonial communities along the Convent Route, the port city of Campeche (also a UNESCO World Heritage Site) in the neighboring state of Campeche and countless 19<sup>th</sup>-century haciendas or estates where henequen or sisal was once cultivated and processed to produce rope, twine and sacking.
